Student Services Update

National Testing Day (Oct 11th)

- Seniors are not in session and encouraged to use this day to work on college applications or a college campus visit opportunity
- Freshman will be taking PreACT 8/9 which is an early opportunity to become familiar with the format of the ACT. This is a paper/pencil and multiple choice test. Students will need to be prepared on test day bringing no. 2 pencils and a calculator.
- Sophomores, Juniors, and those freshmen who were awarded merit scholarships will be taking the PSAT/NMSQT. PSAT provides students with practice for the SAT and gives them access to a free, personalized practice plan for the SAT through the Khan Academy. In addition, for juniors, the PSAT/NMSQT (National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test) serves as an entry point to many scholarship opportunities as well as recognition through the National Merit Scholarship Corporation.
- New this year: The PSAT will be administered to students digitally using an app that will be loaded onto their iPads.
- Dismissal will be early—around 11:15.

ACT Testing Day (Oct 17th)

- This is an optional opportunity for any juniors and seniors interested in taking the ACT.
- Benefits to taking it during the school day—convenient for students who may have Saturday morning conflicts; opportunity to test in a comfortable environment rather than at an outside test site; offered at a discounted rate \$46 as opposed to \$68.
- In order to register, a student or parent must submit the google form which was shared in DeTales as well as the School Counselor Connect Google Classrooms for the class of 2024 and 2025. Payment needs to be submitted prior to test day to Lisa Hoyer in the Student Services Center.
- As of today, we have 74 students registered (61% juniors, 39% seniors). Space is limited to 100. Deadline to register is Sept 26th.
- Mrs. Shelton is the ACT Coordinator and will be in contact with registered students after the registration deadline.

College Visits/Suburban College Fair (Oct 8)

- We have over 50 colleges scheduled to visit our campus this fall mid-September through early November. Juniors and seniors are encouraged to attend up to 5 of these visits with college admissions representatives. It is a great opportunity to ask questions, get tips for the application process, and demonstrate interest. Students can view the rep visit schedule and register for these visits through their Naviance account.
- The Columbus Suburban College Fair has been serving thousands of Central Ohio students for over 40 years. Mrs. Shelton represents SFD on the planning committee for the fair along with high school counselors from area districts including Westerville, Dublin, Hilliard, Worthington, Olentangy, Upper Arlington, Bexley, New Albany. This year's fair will again be held at Otterbein University on Sunday, October 8th from 1-3:30. Students of all grade levels are encouraged to attend. It is a great opportunity for collecting materials, asking questions and getting on mailing lists for various colleges. Students are encouraged to register in advance through a website called Strive Fair in

order to generate a barcode that will allow them to easily share their information with the college representatives on the day of the fair. Over 100 colleges/universities are registered. Families should park at The Point (60 Collegeview Rd) and bussing will be provided to the Clements Recreation Center. Students are encouraged to wear SFD gear to the fair.

SOS

We are preparing to implement the Signs of Suicide Prevention Program on November 6th and 7th. The SOS program encourages conversation around mental health issues, include depression and suicide, among school staff, families, and students. This is our second year of running this program with the support of the Center for Suicide Prevention and Research at Nationwide Children's Hospital. This program will be received by our sophomore students through their English classes (current juniors received the program last year). Our sophomore English teachers will be trained to present the material. As part of the program, students will have the opportunity to fill out a response card to express if they are concerned about themselves or a peer. They will also take a brief screener that is designed to identify at-risk students. There is a caregiver/community education component to this program to provide parents and guardians with the opportunity to learn about warning signs to look for and how to respond when concerned.
